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

(Telugu Poem)


Divinity is all-pervasive. Never doubt that God is here and not there. The Bharatiyas worship even a small roadside stone. They worship even an anthill, in which poisonous

snakes live. There is no object in this world which is not worshipped by the Bharatiyas. They worship hillock considering every it as sacred Govardhan mountain and every hillock as the Himalayas. In this manner. every hillock. anthill, tree, bird and stone is the object of veneration for the Bharatiyas. They feed the ants by providing food to them in the form of rice flour and look after them with love. In this way, this sacred land of Bharat earned the reputation as the land of compassion and penance. Since ancient times, Bharat has been sharing her spiritual wealth with other countries and promoting peace and prosperity in the world. In this modern age also, one should not forget such sacred traditions and divine feelings associated with the culture of Bharat. Only broad-minded people can understand this truth. But to narrow-minded people, this will appear to be foolishness.

Follow Spiritual Path

Where is the place where there is no God? Which is the object that is not permeated with divinity? Everything is God. Anoraneeyan Mahato Maheeyan (Brahman is subtler than the subtlest and vaster than the vastest). All objects in this world are a combination of atoms. Is there any scientist in the world who can deny the existence of divinity in every atom of the universe? If he denies this, then he is no scientist at all. There is divine effulgence in every atom. That is why Ramdas sang, Anta Ramamayam Jagamanta Ramamayam (the Rama principle permeates the entire universe). There is no principle other than Rama principle in this world. The Divine Name of Rama is that which confers bliss. Due to the defective modern system of education, the students are forgetting this divine principle. Modern education is only for a living; it does not illumine the intellect.

Today there is no fear of sin. Wicked deeds and acts of cruelty have become an everyday occurrence. Their magnitude is beyond all description. Devotion to the Lord has become extinct. Oh man! Understand that you can attain peace and happiness only by chanting the Divine Name. (Telugu Poem)

Oh man! Do not feel proud of your education. If you do not offer your salutations to God and do not think of Him with devotion, all your education will become useless. (Telugu Poem)

Oh man! You struggle hard in life merely for the sake of filling your belly. You acquire myriad types of knowledge from various fields. Examine and enquire for yourself what great happiness have you achieved by spending all the time from dawn to dusk in acquiring worldly knowledge and earning wealth while forgetting God? (Telugu Poem)

Jantunam Nara Janma Durlabham (of all living beings, human birth is the rarest). Having attained such a precious human birth, is it what you are supposed to attain? Should you attain this type of mundane happiness in your life? No. no. Your purpose and your goal of life is different. What you should achieve is true happiness. But forgetting such an eternal and everlasting happiness, you are craving for ephemeral and transient happiness. No doubt, secular education is required. I don't dispute that. Worldly education is for life here and spiritual education is for life hereafter. However, worldly education leads only to the path of Pravritti (worldliness). What you should follow is the path of Nivritti (spirituality).

All that is related to Pravritti is momentary and transient, and all that is related to Nivritti is true and eternal. That is why you should aim at attaining the happiness that comes from following the path of Nivritti. Books are no doubt full of knowledge. But what is the use if the head is filled with mud? How far is the bookish knowledge useful? If your head is filled with mud, even the knowledge contained in the books will become useless

for you like mud. What is the reason? The reason is association with wrong company. When you fill your Mastaka (head) with knowledge contained in Pustaka (book), your Mastaka itself will become Pustaka. What you need to acquire is not the knowledge of Pustaka, but the knowledge of Mastaka. That is practical knowledge. It is possible to acquire practical knowledge only when you follow the path of spirituality.

Deservedness Depends upon Faith

Yad Bhavam Tad Bhavati (as are the feelings, so is the result). When your feeling and faith are sacred, the result is also bound to be sacred. In olden days, there used to be a niche in the wall at the entrance of well-to-do families, in which they used to place a small lighted lamp. The people of the village would come to their house to light their lamp from it. This tradition originated from the belief that if they lighted their lamps from the one kept in the house of a prosperous family, they would also become prosperous. In accordance with this tradition, Yashoda also kept a lighted lamp in the outer wall of her house so that the Gopikas of the village could come and light their lamp from it. It was the time when Krishna had left Gokul and was living in Mathura. There was a newly married Gopika named Suguna who came to Repalle after her marriage. When she heard the Divine Leelas of Krishna in Repalle, she became ecstatic and thought it was her misfortune that she had come to Repalle only after Krishna had left for Mathura. She felt dejected and cursed her fate, thinking: Is it possible to change one's destiny? Earlier her mother-in-law used to come to the house of Yashoda to light her lamp. Once it so happened that her motherin-law was laid up with fever. So, she had to go to Yashoda's house to light the lamp. This opportunity turned out to be her good fortune. She was overjoyed to think that she would be seeing the place where Krishna lived and moved around. She approached the house of Yashoda with pure heart and total faith in Krishna. Experience of divinity depends on faith rather than on spiritual practices or scholarship. There have been many great scholars, vogis and men of great penance and sacrifice in this world. But they could not attain the deservedness that was attained by Suguna. Right from the time when she set her foot in Repalle, she was contemplating on Krishna all the time, thinking that she did not have the good fortune to see Krishna.

When she lighted her lamp from the lamp placed in the house of Yashoda, she saw Krishna in the flame. She became so ecstatic that she lost all her body consciousness. She even did not know that her fingers were getting burnt in the flame. Seeing this, Yashoda came running and asked, "Where are you, my dear? You are not even aware that your hand is getting burnt! Have you fallen asleep? Did you not sleep last night?" Other Gopikas who had come to light their lamp also watched this. Suguna was seeing Krishna in the flame all the time, and as a result she had no body consciousness. The other Gopikas surrounded her and asked, "What is the matter? What are you seeing?" When she said that she had seen Krishna, the Gopikas burst into a joyous dance, singing:

Our Suguna had the vision of Krishna in the house of Nanda.

Krishna appeared to her in the flame of the lamp. (Telugu Song)

What type of Sadhana and worship did Suguna perform? She had no knowledge of spiritual practices like Japa and Dhyana (chanting and meditation). Women in those times were not educated. That, in fact, was their good fortune. If they had this type of modern education, they would not have been able to attain such divine bliss. Their entire focus in those days was on divinity. But the focus of modern students is always on acquiring bookish knowledge. After they acquire the bookish knowledge, their focus shifts to passing the examination. During the time of examination, they drink cups and cups of tea and coffee to keep themselves awake at night. Thereby they ruin their health and lose their memory power also. In this way, man today is ruining his innate powers. But people like Suguna in those days always focused on Krishna. It was their firm faith that was responsible for their deservedness. Deservedness depends upon faith and nothing else. When one wants to go to the terrace of one's house, one has to climb a ladder. The ladder has to have support at both ends, at the base and also at the top. Love is the support at the base of this ladder of spirituality and faith is the support at the top. Without the support of love and faith, it is not possible to reach spiritual heights. In fact, to develop love and faith is the real Sadhana.

God can Come to the Houses of Devotees in Any Form

During the time of Shirdi Sai Avatar, there was an ardent devotee of Baba named Hemadpant. His other name was Annasaheb Dabholkar. He always contemplated on Baba and kept repeating, "Baba, Baba, Baba" all the time. One day, he was awakened at night at 3 o'clock by a tall person who patted on his back and said, "Hemadpant! Tomorrow I am coming to your house for food." He


wondered whether what he saw was a dream or a reality. When he noticed that the door of his house was open, he realised that this was not a dream. Then he was filled with joy and started shouting loudly, "My Baba came to me and told me that he would come to my house for food tomorrow." Hearing this, his wife got up and asked, "What happened to you? Did you have a dream? Have you gone mad that you are talking so loudly like this? How is it possible for Baba to come tomorrow? Where is Shirdi and where is our house? All this is your imagination only." Then Hemadpant said to his wife, "Oh foolish woman! For God, there is nothing like far or near. How can there be any coming and going for God who is all-pervasive? God neither comes nor goes; He is everywhere. Those who have deservedness can see Him anywhere. But those who lack deservedness cannot see Him. It all depends on one's faith."

Hemadpant told his wife, "Baba will come to our house tomorrow. Therefore, prepare befitting food tomorrow morning." She was very happy to hear that and said, "Is there any greater fortune for us than Baba visiting our house?" She got up early in the morning, cleaned the house and the cooking utensils and prepared many delicious items such as Vada (savoury snack of South India), Payasam (sweet pudding), etc. She decorated the house with mango leaves and garlands of flowers and waited for the arrival of Baba. It was 12 o'clock, but no sign of Baba's arrival was visible. Therefore, she was beset with anxiety. Then Hemadpant tried to pacify her, saying, "Baba will never go back on his promise. Baba is the embodiment of truth. In fact, he is verily Lord Sathyanarayana. Therefore, Baba will definitely come." It was

already two o'clock but Baba did not come. Hemadpant did not know what to do. At that very time, two persons came to their house and said. "Hemadpant! You appear to be very busy. May be, you are waiting for the arrival of some relatives. That is why you have already prepared food for them. Hence, it does not appear proper for us to disturb you at this time. We will come later. But kindly take this packet." Hemadpant took the packet, and they left. When he opened the packet, he found Baba's picture in it. He put the picture close to his head with reverence and exclaimed. "Oh dear Baba! You have come to my house in the form of this picture!"

eyes, a Vada was missing from the plate of food. He could also see the marks of Baba's fingers in the rice served in the plate. Then he said with joy, "Baba has eaten the food," and offered it as Prasadam to all. Baba used to satisfy his devotees in this manner. Having given his word to his devotees that he would visit their house, he would come to them in some form or the other. In order to make his devotees realise that God is present in all beings, he went to their house in the form of animals also like a buffalo, a cat, a dog, etc., and partook of the food meant for him.

God is Present in All Beings

Now I don't do like that. Once I promise that I will come to your house and accept your food, I will go Myself and have food there. I told many people that on coming to Mumbai, I would visit their house and have food there. Accordingly, I went to their houses and partook of the food served by them. Only then were they happy. What is the reason of their happiness? It is the result of their love, faith and feelings. Devotees in those days were full of love and total faith. But people today have only part-time faith. When God tells them that He will come to their house, they are very happy at that time. But later, they start doubting whether Swami will come or not. They also think that Swami might have casually told them for their satisfaction. Never give room to such doubts. When you develop total faith in Swami's words, they will certainly come true. God's words are divine and ambrosial. They are ever true. But if you lack faith, they may not come true.

Therefore, develop firm faith. Come what may, you should never give up your faith under any circumstances. Faith is your lifebreath. In My Avatar as Shirdi Sai Baba, some people could not understand the subtle meanings of My words and actions. They would come to Baba and complain, "Baba! We were waiting for you because you promised to come. Why did you disappoint us? Why did you put us to so much trouble? What sin have we committed?" Then Baba would reply, "You people are really very foolish. I did come to your house. But you drove me away with a stick." These devotees would wonder and say, "What Baba! Can we ever commit this sacrilege of chasing you away with a stick?" Then Baba would tell them that he came to their house in the form of a black dog. In this manner, Baba demonstrated the truth that God is present in all beings.

When you see a rat, you try to catch it in a rat trap or kill it with a stick. But when you see it with Lord Ganesh, you offer your salutations to it. Similarly, when you see a snake, you try to kill it or call a snake charmer to catch it. But you offer your salutations to it when you see it adorning Lord Siva. However, Vinayaka continued to be where he was without even bothering to call his vehicle rat. When he noticed Subrahmanya returning after completing his journey around the world, he circumambulated Parvati and Parameswara and declared himself to be the winner of the race. Then Parvati, said, "How clever you are? What sort of knack is this? Your brother returned after going round the world. Therefore, he deserves the reward.

How can you claim to have gone round the world by merely circumambulating us?" It was not as if Parvati and Parameswara were not aware of this truth. BHAGAVAN'S 86TH BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS



HE 86TH BIRTHDAY OF Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba was celebrated at Prasanthi Nilayam with great solemnity

and piety. During the weeklong celebrations, many music and cultural programmes were organised.

RATHOTSAVAM AND SITA RAMA KALYANAM

The sacred function of Rathotsavam marked the auspicious beginning of the celebration of Bhagavan's 86th Birthday at Prasanthi Nilayam. The celebration of Sita Rama Kalyanam (celestial wedding of Sita and Rama) on this sacred day this year

heightened the devotional fervour associated with Rathotsavam. The festivities began with sacred Vedic chants at 8 o'clock on the morning of 18th November 2011 in Sai Kulwant Hall which was profusely decorated with colourful buntings, festoons of various designs and flowers of different hues.

After about 20 minutes of Veda chanting, celebration of Sita Rama Kalvanam began in the central area of Sai Kulwant Hall where the decorated idols of Sita and Rama were placed on a raised platform. Explaining the significance of the celestial wedding, the chief priest remarked that it was an event of great spiritual import and was being conducted for the welfare of entire mankind and peace in the world. After reciting invocatory prayers, the chief priest performed the worship of the idols with chanting of sacred Mantras. He then conducted the sacred ceremony as per the tradition. The celestial wedding concluded at about 9.00 a.m. with the offer of Mangal Sutra (sacred thread worn by married women) to Mother Sita amidst sacred Vedic chants and sweet notes of Nadaswaram music.

Soon after this, the palanquin carrying the idol of Lord Krishna was brought out of the Bhajan Mandir. Thereafter, the idols of Rama, Sita, Lakshmana and Hanuman were placed on another palanguin. After the Mandir priest offered Arati to the idols, both the palanguins led by Nadaswaram musicians and Veda chanting and Bhajan singing groups of students were led in a procession to Gopuram Gate where a decorated Ratha (chariot) had already been stationed to carry the idol of Lord Krishna on it. As the chariot procession proceeded towards Sri Pedda Venkama Raju Kalyana Mandapam in Puttaparthi village, a large number of residents of Puttaparthi came out of their houses to witness the procession, broke



THE DIVINE PRINCIPLE PRESENT IN ALL IS THE SAME




REAT TEACHERS belong to mankind. It is wrong to believe that Jesus belongs only to the Christians and that

Christmas is a holy festival for the West only. Christ, Rama, Krishna are for all men, everywhere. To accept one of them as one's own and discard the rest as belonging to others is a sign of pettiness.

Differences Cause Loss of Divine Grace

Various limbs and organs together form a body. Various States and communities together form the world. The sustenance given by Divine grace circulates in every part of the body, helping it to function in unison. The sustenance of love, endowed by Divine grace, has to circulate in every State and community to make the world live in peace and joy. If this truth is realised, there will arise no idea of difference.

If the members of a family are at loggerheads, the lands and other possessions of the family will be uncared for, and either wasted or

lost. The separation of one member will also be a big loss, for, the grace that sustains the family will diminish and get lost. When a hand is amputated, the limb loses its function, and a great deal of blood, too, is lost during the removal. So, too, the Divine grace of love is lost when a country sets itself apart. It also becomes a weak and functionless limb of the world community.

Divisions, differences and distinctions cut one off from the life-giving grace that feeds every cell of the body and every individual in the world. The world is sustained by the self-same grace. A tree requires for its growth, soil, sunlight and atmosphere. But more than these three, it requires the seed. Man's life is conditioned by feelings and deeds, and the consequences of these feelings and deeds. His existence, his very Is-ness depends on the Will of God.

Growing trees may differ according to the nature and quality of the soil and the quantity of sunlight. So, too, men may differ according to the consequences of the types of feelings and deeds that emanate from them. Just as it is true to say that the seeds are the same, the divine principle present in all is the same, without any difference. The variety of forms, the variety of emotions and attitudes, the variety of communities and loyalties are the result of man's ignoring his fundamental unity in the Divine Will, and his acting contrary to that unity.

Realise the Fundamental Principle of Unity

The moving water of a river has the moon in its depths. The still water of a lake has also the moon underneath. The sky has the moon up above. The moon in the flowing river is broken and fragmentary, it flows fast, apparently, with the floods. The moon in the lake is calm, unmoved, undistracted. These two are but reflections of the real moon in the sky. The moon reflected in the flood is the individual soul, engaged in activity, embroiled in Maya, cause and effect. The moon reflected in the placid face of the lake is the yogi, the saint who has attained balance, equipoise, peace, dwelling in the One. The real moon, in the sky, is the Eternal Witness, the Absolute, the Primal Principle.

Christ spoke of these three, when he made, one after the other, three statements. Referring to the active individual soul, the flickering moon, he said, "I am the Messenger of God." Referring to himself as a yogi, who has risen beyond dualities, and attained balance, he said, "I am the son of God." Realising that these two are but reflections, and that the real moon is the witness in the sky, that he too is the formless, nameless absolute, he declared, towards the end of his life, "I and my Father are One."

Celebrate Christmas in a Sacred Way

The ways in which Christmas is being celebrated now show how far men have moved away from those ideals, how much ignominy they are heaping on his name! The midnight hour is revered, illumination is arranged, the Christmas tree is set up, and then the night is spent in drinking and dance. It is a day of holy Ananda, but the Ananda (bliss) is reduced to the level of the poisoning excitement of intoxication!

Drinking is so pernicious an evil habit that when man puts the bottle in, he himself gets

into the bottle and cannot escape! First man drinks wine, then the wine drinks more wine; and finally, the wine drinks man himself! He is sunk and drowned in drink. Liquor destroys the humanity in man. How then can it develop the Divinity in him? One must dance in divine bliss. Instead, sensual dance is indulged in as a deleterious substitute! Make your hearts pure, your activities holy, and your feelings beneficial to all. That is the best way of celebrating the birth of Christ.

Shed Narrowness of Mind

From the narrow vision of "individual need," man must voyage out into the broad vision of the universal. When a drop of water falls into the ocean, it loses its narrow individualities, its name and form. It assumes the form, name and taste of the ocean itself. If it seeks to live separately as a drop, it will soon evaporate and be reduced to non-existence. Each one must become aware that he is part of the one truth that encompasses everything in the universe. It is reprehensible to stick to low narrow paths of selfishness, envy and greed for one's whole lifetime. Make the heart big and the mind pure. Then only can peace and prosperity be established on the earth.

This day is a holy day, the day on which Jesus was born. He announced himself as the Messenger of God. The fact is, all humans are born as messengers of God. The sole purpose of this human career is to propagate the omnipresence of God, His might and glory. No one has incarnated for merely consuming quantities of food and catering to one's senses. After this, the students of Sri Sathya Sai School, Surat presented a drama entitled "Living in Sai's Omnipresence" which showcased the omnipresence of Kali Yuga Avatar, Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba and brought home this profound truth to enlighten one and all to realise His presence in everyone, thus promoting unity and peace in the world. Convocation Oath, Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning



HE 30TH CONVOCATION OF Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning (SSSIHL) (Deemed to be University) was held in Sai Kulwant Hall, Prasanthi Nilayam,

in the Divine Presence, on 22nd November 2011.

Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba inaugurated the Institute on this day, thirty years ago, in 1981. Bhagavan Baba founded this unique institution with the prime objective of developing women and men of character. He desired that His students be academically competent, socially sensitive and spiritually aware; and present themselves as role models and proactive agents of change in

society. Bhagavan established the Institute on the lines of a modern Gurukula, with His teachers playing the noble role of the Guru moulding the personality of the students. Right from the inception of this Institute, Bhagavan always highlighted the crucial role of a teacher in such an education system. He compared the teachers to the overhead tank and the students to taps.

The "Sai Krishna Award" for Research and Teaching

In this spirit, on 21st November, on the eve of the 30th Convocation, the Institute started a new initiative, the "Sai Krishna Award" for excellence in research and teaching, to recognise and felicitate its top researchers

for their active research work and research accomplishments. This year, the three winners of the award were researchers in the fields of Sciences; Management, Commerce, Economics and Education; and Languages and Philosophy.

Annual Convocation Drama

The research award ceremony was followed by the Convocation Drama, which is a highly anticipated event at Prasanthi Nilayam. It is a conduit through which the university students enact the practical lessons that the Founder Chancellor has enunciated for humanity at large.

This year, the drama was entitled "Guru Mahima." The story revolved around a Music Acharya (teacher) and his students at an Ashram, interspersed with scenes from the Ramayana and a scene between King Akbar and Tansen, his court singer. With music and drama, the students brought home the significance of the spiritual relationship that exists between a Master and his disciples. They portrayed the loving bond that persists between them even in the absence of the Master's physical presence, and how his teachings and influence always work through them.

The Convocation Ceremony

The Convocation at SSSIHL is different from 'graduation day' at any other university in two ways. First, the ceremonial oath serves as a fitting reminder for all students to re-dedicate themselves to the vision of Bhagavan Baba, the Founder Chancellor, and to practise His teachings in their daily lives. Second is the Benedictory Address by the Founder Chancellor. It must be noted that at no other university does the Chancellor himself speak on the occasion

of the Convocation. At SSSIHL, the Founder Chancellor, who is the Sadguru, addresses the students on Convocation day, giving them the Upadesa, which serves as their guiding advice before they go out into the world.

The Chief Guest at the Convocation this year was Prof. P. Balaram, Director, Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru. He, along with the Vice Chancellor, and other dignitaries including former Vice Chancellors, Members of the Board of Trustees, Board of Management and the Academic Council, entered the venue in a procession that was led by the brass band of the Institute. Following the convention, the procession was headed by two students carrying the Institute's Standards on either side of the Registrar, who carried the Ceremonial Mace.

The function began with Veda chanting, after which the formal proceedings began with the voice of the Founder Chancellor, Bhagavan Baba, declaring the Convocation open to rapturous applause from the audience.

Vice Chancellor's Introductory Speech

The Vice Chancellor reiterated the Institute's resolve to work towards fulfilling Bhagavan's Mission by following His ideals. He outlined the progress made by the Institute during the last year and spoke about the new initiatives undertaken by it. Amongst others, this included the setting up of an advanced research facility in the near future. The Vice Chancellor then introduced the Chief Guest, Prof. P. Balaram.

Graduands Receive their Degrees and Award of Gold Medals

The Controller of Examinations of the Institute presented the graduands to the



Revered Founder Chancellor for award of degrees. Following this, the customary oath was administered to the students by the Vice Chancellor. Gold medals were thereafter awarded to the meritorious students for their excellence in academic performance. The recipients of gold medals came one by one, sought the blessings of the Revered Founder Chancellor, received the gold medal from the Vice Chancellor and stood by the chair of the Revered Founder Chancellor for a photograph.

Chief Guest's Convocation Address

In his Convocation Address, the Chief Guest, Prof. P. Balaram hailed the Institute as a unique one that evolved over three decades under Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba's able guidance with discipline as its hallmark. He stressed the importance of research and suggested that to confront major scientific and technological challenges facing us in today's world, the boundaries between the different academic disciplines needed to be blurred and seamlessly integrated. Elucidating on the subject on how to become successful, the learned speaker stressed on the need to work hard, irrespective of failures. Failure is a common phenomenon that one should treat with equanimity, he said, and overcome with discipline, hard work, commitment and imagination. He gave the example of the rags-to-riches story of author J.K. Rowling of the 'Harry Potter' fame, and concluded by wishing the graduating students all success.

Revered Founder Chancellor's Benedictory Address

This was followed by the benediction of the Founder Chancellor (beamed on video screens) on the importance of combining secular education with spiritual knowledge; of being patriotic and serving one's motherland; and of facing life's challenges with courage. Reiterating the importance of the principles, Adhyatma Vidya Vidyanam (spiritual education is true education) and Sa Vidya Ya Vimuktaye (true education is that which liberates) propounded in sacred texts. Bhagavan emphasised that true education spiritual education which enables students to realise their divinity. Referring to the principles of Indian culture, Bhagavan advised the students to follow the principles such as Matru Devo Bhava, Pitru Devo Bhava, Acharya Devo Bhava, Atithi Devo Bhava (revere your mother, father, preceptor and guest as God). There was nothing great in acquiring a degree, said Bhagavan, and added that what was important was service to the mother and motherland. In conclusion, Bhagavan remarked that students were His property and they would make Him happy if they served their parents. The programme ended with the singing of the National Anthem followed by Mangala Arati.

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"Hari Bhajan Bina Sukha Santhi Nahin" and "Prema Mudita Manase Kaho Rama Rama Ram." The Akhanda Bhajan concluded at 6.00 p.m. on 13th November 2011 with offer

of Arati at the Samadhi of Bhagavan. At the conclusion of the Bhajan, Prasadam of tamarind rice and sweet rice was distributed to the entire gathering in the hall.



NEWS FROM SAI CENTRES

CANADA

ITH BHAGAVAN BABA'S blessings, the new Sri Sathya Sai Baba Centre of Scarborough, Ontario was inaugurated during Easwaramma Day celebrations from 6th to 8th May 2011. The new facility consists of two floors. On the first floor, a grand, marble-tiled and ornate sanctum houses a large and majestic portrait of Bhagavan, which had been blessed by Him. Besides, it

has a statue of Ganesh and Shirdi Sai Baba, a spacious prayer hall and various office rooms dedicated to Bhagavan. The ground floor consists of a multi-purpose hall, eight classrooms, a library and kitchen facilities.

On 6th May 2011, Veda chanting, Yajna and Bhajans were held. On Saturday, 7th May 2011, spiritual leaders from major religions took part in the invocations, with prayers by

a Chinese-Taoist priest, a Christian minister, a Muslim Imam, a Buddhist monk and a Parsi-Zoroastrian elder. In the evening, a special musical programme, "Atma Gitam," was rendered by the alumni of Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning. In addition to office bearers from regional Sai Organisations inside Canada, representatives of the municipal, provincial and federal branches of the Canadian Government were present.

On 8th May, about 1,500 people took part in Easwaramma Day celebrations, which coincided with Mothers' Day in Canada. The SSE programme of the Sai Centre, now in its 25th year, instructs over 800 children, ranging from 5 to 18 years of age. The Sai Centre facility was built primarily to serve the overwhelming demand by the community to inculcate character and morality education for their children. In addition to the regular spiritual activities of the Centre, service projects such as providing food and clothes to the needy and blood donation drives are undertaken. Recently the provincial government of Ontario, Canada publicly recognised the vast contributions made by the Sai Centre to the community.

UKRAINE

The city of Bohodukhov is in the Kharkov region of eastern Ukraine. With special approvals by the Administrative Board, the Mayor and the Deputy Mayor of the city, Sri Sathya Sai Service Organisation (SSSO) of the Russian-speaking countries organised an international service camp from 5th to 13th August 2011. Over 250 volunteers

including youth and adults from ten countries worked tirelessly in unison to provide loving medicare, educare and sociocare services to the public. In April 2011, representatives from SSSSO Ukraine had visited Bohodukhov to identify the needs of the community. In the medical camp, based at a local hospital, 63 healthcare professionals covering a broad spectrum of specialities, and support-team members from United Kingdom, Europe. U.S.A., Ukraine, Russia. Belarus and Azerbaijan, provided loving medical services to over 4,000 people. Free medicines and new eyeglasses were given out. Healthcare professionals travelled to various villages to care for the patients, including home visits for severely disabled people. During the week, three teams of ophthalmologists worked at different sites where more than 600 new glasses were dispensed to children, adults and the elderly, many of whom were very happy on the restoration of their eyesight. The local doctors were given medical health awareness presentations, and the international team was touched by the love and affection of the devotees from Ukraine and Russia.

In the educational aspect of the project, more than 825 children, including orphans, participated joyfully in "Educare" activities, which included over 108 classes. Human values activities were organised for children up to the age of 13. Guitar and piano lessons and the basics of dance, drawing, embroidery and knitting were taught. Children were also given guidance on improving their eyesight. A project, "Clean Town Day," was arranged to educate people in keeping their surroundings environmentally clean and liveable. A series of events were organised for local parents

as well as teachers on topics relating to "Raising Children with Human Values." The teachers and parents learned new methods of teaching children by being role models. The participants thoroughly enjoyed the "Educare" activities and requested the teaching team to stay in Bohodukhov forever. In their feedback, children said that they learned how to live joyfully in love and about the power of gratitude.

In other service activities, Sathya Sai volunteers worked tirelessly and carried out extensive repairs to various buildings, rooms and sanitary systems that had been left unattended in and around the city and nearby villages. Volunteers reinstalled floors, windows and pipelines, repaired bathrooms and replaced light bulbs in many schools. Nutritional food packets along with essential items such as clothes, footwear and so on were distributed in the hospital, an orphanage and in the villages. A "sustenance" programme was undertaken by purchasing a tool kit for a welder and a hoisting jack for a polyclinic garage, giving financial support for a child who needed advanced medical diagnosis, paying overdue electricity bills for the family of a single mother who had been without electricity for years and who had been suffering through bitter cold winters, purchasing appliances for a gymnasium kitchen including a boiler for hot water, and providing sanitation facilities for a local college and needed items for two visually challenged elderly people. Throughout the day, Sathya Sai volunteers prepared various national dishes using fresh ingredients for the 250 volunteers as well as for the children in the education camp. Sri Vladimir Belyy, the Mayor of Bohodukhov, thanked the Sathya

Sai Organisation and the volunteers for their selfless services and invited them to come back again.

U. S. A.

On 30th July 2011, over 70 Sathya Sai volunteers including children from the Chicago Metro, West and North Suburb Sai Centres, along with volunteers from other organisations, participated community home-building service project called C.R.E.W. (Community Restoration by Ecumenical Workers). The project involved constructing two three-bedroom houses to be later transported to a Habitat for Humanity site in Will County. All volunteers assembled at the parking lot of Peace Memorial Church in Palos Park, a south-western suburb of Chicago. The service project started with a prayer, followed by introduction to safety rules and construction guidelines. With Sai in heart and hammer in hand, wall panels for the homes were lovingly constructed. Bhagavan's messages of love, peace and happiness to all were inscribed on each wall panel being constructed. Once all the wall panels were built, the CREW team assembled the pre-built walls and created the basic structure for one of the houses. The service project ended with a dedication ceremony, with prayers recited for the wellbeing and prosperity of the inhabitants of the houses.

The Sathya Sai Baba Organisation of America, South-east Region (Region 3), organised a tribute to Bhagavan at the Melbourne Civic Centre in Melbourne, Florida on 29th May 2011. About 200 people attended the meeting. Dr. Narendranath Reddy, Chairman, Sri Sathya Sai International

Medical Committee, and Director, Sri Sathya Sai World Foundation was the guest speaker. Dr. Gnana Bhaskar Tenali, president of the Palm Bay Sathya Sai Baba Centre, and Dr. Axay Kalathia, the South-east regional president, spoke initially and introduced the guest speaker. Dr. Reddy gave an inspiring talk and shared Bhagavan's message and some of the life lessons he learned at His Divine Lotus Feet. He reiterated the pledge of Sri Sathya Sai Organisation to continue Bhagavan's Mission with more enthusiasm and dedication. Following Dr. Reddy's talk was a musical performance by Smt. Vasumathi Vasudevan, a wellknown Carnatic vocalist. A soulful rendering of the song, "Kanula Mundara Kadali Ade Karuna Murthivi Neevu," (the embodiment of compassion moves amidst us right in front of our eyes) brought tears to the eyes of all present. During the question-answer session by Dr. Reddy, Bhagavan's divine presence was felt when the stage lights in the auditorium flickered on and off multiple times without a reason. The technician in charge of the auditorium stated that this had never occurred before and that there was no flaw in the lighting system. The devotees and organisers felt the divine hand in the miracle.

KAZAKHSTAN

From 21st to 30th June 2011, the family camp, "Solnyshko," was organised in the Karakystak valley, located at the base of the Sinvuha mountain on the shore of the crystal-clear Lake Malye Schebach'e. Over 55 participants, including children from seven cities across Kazakhstan, participated in the camp. The theme, "United Family of Swami," allowed the participants to focus on demonstrating human values in various aspects of daily life. The atmosphere was surcharged with Bhagavan's love. Sai Olympic Games with the slogan, "Healthy Spirit in a Healthy Body," included a ceremonial march with the five Olympic rings representing the unity of the world religions and the five human values. The Sarva Dharma (all faiths) flag was hoisted as a symbol of the unity of the Sai family worldwide. Bhajans were sung while preparing food for the participants, rendering the food to pulsate with Sattwic (pure) vibrations. Everyday the participants discussed how to practise human values in their daily lives and thus experience Bhagavan's love and light.

MALAYSIA

Since 2002, about 50 to 75 Sathya Sai volunteers, including many youth from Malaysia and Singapore, have been active in village improvement programmes. About 500 people in two of the most remote villages, Perkampungan Bawie and Perkampungan Sepayak, were served from 19th to 23rd April 2011. These service activities, themed as "Sustainable Action Initiatives" (S.A.I.), included the distribution of plants, vegetable seeds and fruit trees, along with programmes to educate villagers on proper cultivation methods. About 45 families were provided.

with basic food supplies. School supplies were distributed to children and raincoats to the villagers. The S.A.I. programme was initiated with the aim of promoting a healthy environment to alleviate the suffering of the villagers.

Medical professionals including doctors and dentists held medical camps and provided loving services to 200 to 300 people, including handing out medicines to patients and vitamins to children. The nearest hospital is approximately 100 kilometres away from the village. Preventive health education programmes were organised on proper personal and dental hygiene. Sathya Sai volunteers offered the villagers haircuts followed by medicated shampoo treatments for lice. Sarongs, towels, "Sathya Sai Avatar" T-Shirts and 300 pairs of slippers were given away.

BHARAT

Andhra Pradesh: In Visakhapatnam district, all the major Samithis jointly conducted an 86-hour non-stop Nama Sankirtan

programme for four days starting from 5 a.m. on 12th October 2011 to 7 p.m. on 16th October 2011. A large number of devotees participated in devotional singing with great enthusiasm and devotion.

As part of 86th Birthday celebrations of Bhagavan, Rajam Samithi in Srikakulam district organised 'Saptaha Dikshalu' for seven days in Sundaram Mandir where 86-hour Akhanda Nama Sankirtan was also conducted.

Gujarat: Sri Sathya Sai Seva Samithi, Surat and Prashanti Charitable Trust organised a function at 11 a.m. on 12th October 2011 at Sri Sathya Sai Seva Sankul, Althan, Surat to inaugurate Sri Sathya Sai Medical Van, sponsored by ONGC Hazira. The programme started with three Omkars followed by Veda chanting. Sri S.K. Jain, Executive Director, ONGC Hazira inaugurated the medical van and handed over the key of the van to Sri Manohar Trikannad, State President, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation, Gujarat. The function concluded with offering of Arati.

Jammu and Kashmir: Under SSSVIP activities in selected villages, nine marriages of poor girls were conducted in villages named Burmal, Rehal Kalanderian, Rehal Dhamalian and Halqua Marh where arrangements were made for catering of food, wedding clothes, ornaments, etc. This way, the marriages were conducted in a smooth way which gave solace to needy villagers.

Kerala: An essay competition for college and higher secondary school students was held in August 2011, in which about 17,000 students from more than 2,000 institutions participated. The topics were 'Mind Management is Life Management' and 'God is One, but Paths are Different.' Sri Sathya Sai gold medals were

awarded by All India President to winners on the Onam Day at Prasanthi Nilayam.

The Sai Organisation of Kerala is now fully involved in the work of eradication of evils, especially among the student community. The programme is named as "Stop-Stop,Think, Organise and Proceed." Under this, experts concentrate on evil effects of drug addiction, smoking, misuse of internet, and non-vegetarian food, etc. This has already been organised in Alleppey, Palakkad and Thiruvananthapuram-North districts. Video presentations, classes by experts, exhibitions, etc., were some of the items. In Palakkad, 4,000 students, parents and others attended one-day programme held at Chittur.

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

In the same way, different religions of the world see only one aspect of God. They can attain the knowledge of God in all His aspects only when they all join together.


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conference. On this occasion, the youth planted about 100 saplings of flowering plants in and around the Mandir complex and road side. They also presented devotional songs.

HE UPANISHADS, ALSO called the Vedanta, are the distilled essence and culmination of the Vedas. Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba has further distilled and expounded His "Upanishad Vahini" in His inimitable elegant and pleasant manner the essence of the ten Upanishads which are considered the beginning of the journey of the Sadhaka towards the experience of Brahman.
